Re: The Louisiana Assembly

Dear Sheriffs:

This correspondence serves as a Second Notice and formal Notice of Fault regarding our prior communication dated February 25, 2025, which remains unanswered and unacknowledged. Failure to rebut or respond with lawful authority constitutes tacit admission and agreement, as stipulated under the principles of estoppel by acquiescence. You, as sheriffs and deputies, have been duly informed of the jurisdictional boundaries that separate living men and women from incorporated entities and of your lawful duties as peacekeepers on the land and soil jurisdiction of Louisiana. Continued silence or nonperformance further affirms your personal and commercial liability for any harm, trespass, or unlawful enforcement upon members of the lawful Louisiana Assembly. We urge you to cure this fault immediately and engage in good faith communication to restore honorable relations and prevent further escalation of liability.

First Notice

This letter is being written as a peaceful but necessary gesture to inform you and your deputies of certain facts regarding our lawful, unincorporated Louisiana Assembly, and to provide important

updates and to reaffirm the principles that should guide our duties as peacekeepers in these evolving times. The lawful Louisiana Assembly is populated by American State Nationals, and American State Citizens. We are Louisianans, peacefully assembled, and working to restore our lawful government, which is our right.

You and your deputies have been operating under a jurisdiction which is a commercial, maritime, administrative, incorporated entity, established by the Territorial or Municipal Constitution. You are authorized to deal with Corporations. We are living men and women on your Parish and as such not under your jurisdiction. The Louisiana Assembly members are, in fact, foreign sovereigns with respect to your commercial, administrative jurisdiction.

As a peacekeeping sheriff when operating on the land and soil jurisdiction, you hold the highest peacekeeping authority within your parish. If you are acting in honor and decency in this position, you would also be indemnified and hold state immunity. In addition, as an honorable peacekeeping sheriff, you would outrank any and all Federal agents, agencies, and State of Louisiana/ State Trust employees who come to your parish, or are in your parish, harassing and violating the rights of Louisiana people. As an honorable peacekeeping sheriff, you are required and expected to protect the people and assets of your parish. This position carries not only immense responsibility but also the trust of those you serve. It is crucial to remember that the true purpose of our work in the lawful Louisiana Assembly is to protect life, freedom, and property, while upholding fairness and justice for all.

Under the land jurisdiction of American common law, it is required that a crime must involve either demonstrable physical harm to an individual or verifiable damage to property. The lawful Louisiana Assembly is presently engaged in a peaceful effort to establish our Jural Assembly and to institute our common law courts, which possess superior concurrent general jurisdiction.

The people of your parish, and the people of Louisiana, are not subject to statutory codes, ordinance, policy and rules, which are only meant for Corporations. The enforcement of these statutory codes and rules (incorrectly referred to as "laws"), that penalize and unlawfully incarcerate peaceful, non-violent men and women, when no actual harm has been done, creates a very serious crime under land law, which is trespass, and you and your deputies are 100% personally and commercially liable for any and all harm done to peaceful Americans, especially Louisiana Assembly members.

In the face of these responsibilities, your role as a sheriff is pivotal. Again, we are making an offer to you to work with us in peace and honor. We will be happy to offer free training about our assembly and the different jurisdictions. More information can also be found at <http://tiny.cc/cara001>.

Enclosed please find a copy of the letter that was sent from the lawful Louisiana Assembly to the incorporated State of Louisiana government officials. It outlines The Louisiana Assembly's initiatives to reconstruct lawful governance in alignment with constitutional principles and American common law. This effort reflects a broader commitment to ensuring that government actions respect and protect the inherent rights of all people on Louisiana. We encourage you to review this document, as it provides valuable context for you to understand what The Louisiana Assembly is doing.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

This letter serves as our Second Notice that The Louisiana Assembly, consisting of American State Nationals and American State Citizens, is now in session. This is based on the Reconstruction Act of 1867. The Louisiana Assembly is the only group of people who have the proper status, standing, and jurisdiction to reconstruct the lawful Louisiana government upon its original foundation. We intend to proceed peacefully according to respect and protection to the rights of all.

“Persons” make up “Jural Societies”, which are subject to admiralty and maritime jurisdiction courts. They are identified as incorporated (Trade and Commercial) business and are “Persons”.

“People” make up “Jural Assemblies”, which are subject to land and soil jurisdiction courts. They are identified as Common Law Courts and operate as unincorporated businesses and are “People”.

The Louisiana Assembly is peacefully engaged in the noble undertaking of self-governance. Our self-governing authority is founded upon the letter and spirit of the Declaration of Independence and American Common Law as adopted within the Charters of the State of the Union, of which Louisiana is one. They, in turn, find their source in the Ten (10) Commandments and The Holy Bible.

The following information is provided to update you regarding the steps we have taken toward the reconstruction of our lawful American government.

Establishing an International Land Recording Office and Permanent Identity System

The Federation of States formed a permanent International Land Recording Office for our Notices of Political Status. The Louisiana Assembly is the lawful issuing authority for Louisiana. These new Land Recording Offices will be held under the authority of land and soil jurisdiction of The United States of America, our unincorporated Federation of States of the Union.

International Peace Treaty by the State Assemblies

The International Peace Treaty has established that Peace has been formally declared, ending the long-standing Conflict known as The American Civil War. This war was in the International and Global Jurisdictions and has continued as a perpetual emergency since March 27, 1861. Our Nation has remained in a constant state of Martial Law and "war" of one kind or another for 158 years. See "International Peace Proclamation" enclosed. On the 26th of June 2021, our States issued a joint Peace Treaty formally ending the hostilities.

Conclusionary Statement of Facts

In conclusion, this document provides notification of The Louisiana Assembly and its standing as a land and soil jurisdiction. It is based on American Common Law and the Ten (10) Commandments, and by the Rule of Law which reigns supreme: i.e., according to both case law, lawful and ethical codes and by those age-old standards.

The Louisiana Assembly welcomes good faith inquiries.

Please be advised that you are required to respond within **ten (10)** days from the date of this notice or you acquiesce.

International Peace Proclamation

To all whom these presents come: this Proclamation provides explicit and official International Notice that Peace has been Declared by and among the Union States of the States of America and Federation States of the Union, in receipt of the authorities of the former Confederate States, in the matter of The American Civil War. All jurisdictions and instrumentalities must comply. All Federal, Territorial, and Municipal Officers, including all Uniformed Officers, must comply.

It is required that all hostilities related to The American Civil War being conducted as a Mercenary Conflict in International and Global Jurisdictions and having been maintained for 156 years by our foreign Subcontractors, must cease and desist without further Legal Presumption of Authority.

With this Public Announcement all Executive Orders issued during and as a result of The American Civil War are set aside effective at midnight the first of August in the year of 2021.

All Medical Officers and all General Staff and Reserve and Retired elements of the American Armed Forces, U.S. Armed Forces, UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES, US ARMED FORCES, Hospital Corps, MEDICAL UNITS, Veterans Administration, United States Department of Defense, UN Peacekeepers, DOD Officers, NATO Officers on shore, all elected, appointed, or promoted personnel and their dependents, are required to cease and desist all gene therapy extinction protocols, coerced injections, mask mandates, and similar measures being promoted by the Territorial and Municipal United States Governments in Breach of Trust and under False Presumptions of War. All peacekeeping officers and police officers are fully informed.

There are no allowable exceptions and no other Powers extended. So said, so signed, and so sealed this first day of August in the year of 2021 by:

International Peace Proclamation

Be it known to All to Whom these Presents come: an International Peace Treaty has been established ending all hostilities related to The American Civil War which unofficially began in 1861 with an Executive Declaration issued by then-Territorial President Abraham Lincoln.

Grand Peace Treaty of the States

Insomuch as a mercenary conflict known as The American Civil War was engendered and fought by members of the Confederation of States existing in 1860, and that conflict has been left unresolved, now let it be agreed and declared that this Grand Peace Treaty of the States has been approved by the Owner States and has been established and bound upon these Several Parties by mutual Treaty Agreement among these and among the Several States now existing, and also applies to all Subcontractors and Employees exercising Delegated Powers:

Agreement 1: That all States and all Confederate States now or in future existing agree to an immediate and permanent cessation of hostilities connected in any way to The American Civil War;

Agreement 2: This cessation of hostilities and resulting peace extends on the soil, in the air, on the land, and at sea, and is also an obligation of all those exercising delegated powers on behalf of our States;

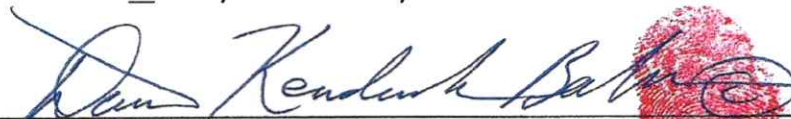
Agreement 3: All the States then-existing and existing now, have abolished by Roll Call Vote all forms of slavery and peonage within their borders, within their Territories and Possessions, and within the realm of their intellectual properties, so that no more legal presumptions, exclusions, or suppositions may be used to evade the paramount provisions of our Organic and Public Laws;

Agreement 4: All the States then-existing and existing now, agree via this Grand Peace Treaty of the States to uphold this peace both within and without their borders and to forever end and release the disputes arising from The American Civil War, and to return all States to their natural status and sovereignty as States of the Union without exception and according to the Equal Footing Doctrine;

Agreement 5: All States now existing agree that the votes of all State Members of the unincorporated Federation of States doing business as The United States of America are now and have remained valid without exception before, during, and after The American Civil War.

So adopted and proclaimed this 26 day of June in the year of 2021.

Enrolling the Western States in the Union

Last year, the Western States, which have been waiting for proper Statehood under the Northwest Ordinance, were finally enrolled, and given their proper Statehood by our first Roll Call Vote of the Assemblies of the States that existed up to the time of the American Civil War. This was effective as of 01 October 2020. This formally ended any emergency-based custodial interest by any foreign government in those States. Now all fifty States have their proper statehood status, standing and jurisdiction for all the Assemblies to move forward together.



Final Enrollment of Post-Civil War States of the Union

"Be it Enacted by Roll Call Vote of the States of the Union that all States created by contract, purchase, and/or voluntary petition after the year of 1860 be Admitted and Enrolled and Accepted as States of the Union with the full powers and the complete jurisdictions of our States of the Union and further be Admitted, Enrolled, and Accepted as members of our unincorporated Federation of States, The United States of America, effective with the original day of their respective contract, purchase, and/or voluntary petition."
