Case Study: Court Procedure Step 3 - “Living Court” Mock Trial Scenario and Generic Script

Court Roles

Claimant

Claimant’s Witness (optional)

Accused

Accused Witness (optional)

Clerk

Justice

Record Keeper

Bondsman

Marshal at Arms

Recording Secretary as **International Notarial Witness**

Scenario Points:

- 1. ASN Land Owner rented house to ASN man/woman.**
- 2. Man/woman stopped paying rent, due to job loss.**
- 3. Job loss was because of injury and car breakdown.**
- 4. Renter had no financial means of paying rent or getting car fixed.**
- 5. This has led to Land owner with land patent taking action to evict renter according to private month-to-month lease agreement**

1. ASN land owner-
 - a. month to month lease agreement - 30 day notice to leave property issued
 - b. Honorable execution of lease agreement
 - c. Accelerated process completed - 3 notices sent and arbitration complete with no resolution
2. ASN Renter -
 - a. Refuses to honor notice to leave the rental house

- b. Now inflicting financial hardship on Landlord and not acting in honor
- 3. Biblical process of attempted resolution has been completed for Steps 1 and 2
 - a. Man (woman) to man (woman)
 - b. 2 or more (Arbitration)
 - c. Documented evidence of this procedure

Court Process Begins here

Participants in Court Process and associated responsibilities step by step

Marshal at Arms – Has initial responsibility for ensuring the courtroom building is secure.

Clerk – Ensures proper paperwork is available to each participant in court

Bondsman – Confirm evidence (is recorded), people, guns and courtroom Zoom is secured/locked. Court is secured in 2 parts: open and close. Zoom call is monitored to be sure only court/case participants are present. **(Process line out for court room to admit all arbitration information to jury)*

Justice – Verifies recorder, clerk, bondsman, and notary are present. “Living Court” begins. Verify with Bondsman all participants have been identified and cleared to be in “Living Court”. Verify initial claim and attempt at resolution was documented.
Verify arbitration has been conducted and Arbitration form(s) is acknowledged by Court seal.

*****RECORDING IS STARTED-with transcript*****

Justice – Begins court, “Today is (day), (date). The time is _____. This is The Washington Common Law Court. I am a State Justice John Quincy Adams in this matter before us today.

Justice – “Statement of Facts”: This is Case #00001 and Living names of Claimant and Accused

Justice – Has the jury been provided court education material for review?

**Administration function.*

Justice – Claimant is first to present recorded facts in evidence.

Claimant – States facts in evidence of what, who, when, how, where, any fees and/or expenses as a result of the trespass. ***Burden of proof is on the Claimant.***

Justice facilitates:

- Jury has opportunity to ask clarifying questions, etc.
- Accused has opportunity to ask clarifying questions, etc.

Justice – Calls witness case #00001. witness is second to testify for Claimant (Optional)

Witness – Tells facts of what, who, when, how, where, any fees and/or expenses as a result of the trespass.

Justice – When witness finishes testimony will facilitate questions:

- Jury has opportunity to ask clarifying questions, etc.
- Accused has opportunity to ask clarifying questions, etc.

Justice – Call to **Accused** for case #00001: **Accused** is third to testify

Accused – Tells story of what, who, when, how, where, and explains his lack of action.

Justice – When witness finishes testimony will facilitate questions:

- Claimant has opportunity to ask clarifying questions
- Jury has opportunity to ask clarifying questions

Witness for the accused provides testimony (optional)

Justice – When witness finishes testimony will facilitate questions:

- Claimant has opportunity to ask clarifying questions

- Jury has opportunity to ask clarifying questions

Justice – This concludes the presentment of evidence and testimony. The jury will now move to deliberation and discussion

Court Recorder - *****PAUSE RECORDING*****

/Zoom host – The recording is paused, jury gathers in the “Living Court” jury room.

Court filings, other evidence

Bondsman – Accompanies jury to jury room. Jury will first hold a vote on Jury Lead. Bondsman and Lead exchange phone #S in case of problem. Bondsman makes sure screen share works and all evidence is able to be seen and is accessible by jury. Bondsman is Jury’s ONLY point of contact. Bondsman leaves, jury begins deliberations.

Note Jury Lead responsibility - keeps order in the jury room and ensures all have an opportunity to speak

Jury Lead – Discussion of list of charges (counts), evidence and facts (who, what, when, where, how) is establishing harm or violation necessary? Did “unlawful pressure” occur? Territorial or American affects? Order or Nullify Order? Findings, award, etc.

Jury Lead - verify jurors in agreement with yay or nay all leave juror room and return to “Living Court” room

Jury Lead – Present written findings to Justice

Jurors – Return to court room.

All Officials, Claimant and Accused also return to court room.

Justice – “The Washington Common Law Court is now resumed. Has the jury reached a unanimous decision?”

Jury Lead – “No, we have not.” (Option #1)

Justice – Justice may have final inquiry into verification of Jury’s decision (i.e hung jury). The final decision is made and spoken to “Living Court” (or Arbitration/may need more evidence).

Forms – Final Resolution by Jury Decision/\$Award/Findings
Form/Order/Nullification Order/Clerks Invitation Request

Justice – Schedule a time for jury to reconvene. “The Washington common Law court is adjourned and will reconvene on _____.

Justice – “Has the jury reached a verdict?”

Jury Lead – “Yes we have.” (Option #2)

Justice – Reads verdict

Justice – “The Washington Common Law Court is now adjourned”

*****STOP RECORDING*****

Seals order or, moves back to Arbitration (form required)

Bondsman –

Seal case document and provide all documents/evidence to the clerk to make copies as needed , and provide to Record Keeper.

Determine need for courier if jury decision to be delivered later and inform the Clerk.

Clerk –

Process all paperwork from Bondsman and provide to Record Keeper.

Prepare Orders to be signed by Justice. Once orders are signed, make copies and prepare for mailing Registered Mail w/return receipt or Courier by Sheriff to Claimant and Accused.
